Voter Statistics




Current Voter Registration (Oct. 3, 2022)

1,813,734 voters




Voter Registration by Generation






Current Registration by Party






Voter Registration by Voting Rights Act Languages



- Registration Deadline October 24

- Voting Deadline November 8 at 8 p.m.






County Voter Information Guides and Ballots

What's on the Ballot?

- Top two runoff elections for federal, state, one Superior Court Judge and three County Board of Supervisors offices
- State Supreme Court and Court of Appeal Associate Justices
- 73 city offices
- 63 school and special district offices

- 186 total candidate contests
- 20 local measures

Security and Integrity Measures

- Physical
- Technical
- Process
- People



Security and Integrity Measures – Physical

- Badge access controls
- Auditable security seals on equipment
- Ballot drop boxes
 - Made of military grade metal
 - Bolted to concrete
 - Individually keyed





- Electronic voter check-in with near real-time updates
- Voter data is secured, and encrypted while in transit and at rest
- All votes are cast on paper ballots
- Pre- & post-election confirmation of voting system software version
- Vote tally system is not connected to the internet
- Intrusion detection/prevention systems in place



- Ballot Handling Daily randomized routes, GPS tracking, radio communication with controlled chain of custody
- Signature verification of all vote-by-mail ballots
- Pre-election & post-election Logic and Accuracy tests
- 1% Manual Tally and Risk Limiting Audit
- Partnership Law enforcement & District Attorney's office
- Partnership Department of Homeland Security



Security and Integrity – People

- Background checks on all employees
- Extensive training provided to all employees
- Two-person integrity for movement of ballots
- Use of Sheriff's deputies and security officers
- Command Center/Vote Center Help Desk
- Rapid deployment teams




Media at Vote Centers - Reminders
