

**CALENDAR OF EVENTS FOR ORANGE COUNTY DISTRICTS  
NOVEMBER 3, 2026 GENERAL ELECTION  
For District Use Only**

Shown below is a sequence of events, including statutory deadlines and Registrar of Voters' administrative deadlines, leading to the General Election on November 3, 2026. This sequence shows the actions a District Board of Directors would need to take to place a district measure on the ballot.

The recommended administrative deadlines will enable the Registrar of Voters to establish deadlines for the submittal of filings related to a measure, which provide a reasonable time to prepare the election material, the full 10-day public examination periods for the submitted filings, and sufficient time to resolve a petition for writ of mandate challenging any of the election materials without substantially interfering with the conduct of the election.

It is statutorily permissible for the District Board of Directors to order a district measure election up until 88 days before Election Day. If the election is ordered less than 109 days before Election Day, the Registrar of Voters would endeavor to conduct the election as ordered and would set expedited filing deadlines for election materials. Even with such shortened deadlines, there would not be much time left for a court to resolve a legal challenge without impacting the conduct of the election.

All statutory references are to the Elections Code, unless stated otherwise.

<b>July 1, 2026 (E-125)</b>	If a District plans to order a district measure election, the District must submit a boundary map of district and divisions to the Registrar of Voters no less than 125 days before the election. <b>§ 10522</b>
<b>July 17, 2026 (E-109)</b>	<p>The Registrar of Voters requests that a District Board of Directors adopt a Resolution(s) to order a district measure election, to request consolidation of the district measure election with the General Election, and to request the election services of the Registrar of Voters. The District must submit the Resolution(s) to the Board of Supervisors with a copy to the Registrar of Voters.</p> <p>If the District wishes to have a full text of the measure printed in the County Voter Information Guide, the Registrar of Voters requests the District submit the full text by this date. <b>§§ 9316, 9380, 10002, 10403, 10418</b></p>
<b>July 31, 2026 (E-95)</b>	Recommended date for filing measure ordinance text, direct arguments, County Counsel impartial analysis and a fiscal impact statement (if applicable). If your Board of Directors passes a Resolution prior to <b>July 31, 2026</b> , the Registrar of Voters will adjust the material submission deadline date accordingly. <b>§§ 9313, 9314, 9315, 9316</b>

	When filing direct arguments, the parties must provide a list of supporters or opponents to the district measure that will be printed on the ballot. The list must not exceed 125 characters in length including spaces, commas, semicolons, and other characters. <b>§ 9170</b>
<b>August 1, 2026 through August 10, 2026 (E-94 – 85)</b>	Public Review period for the measure ordinance text, impartial analysis, direct arguments, and fiscal impact statement, if applicable. Measure documents will be posted on the Registrar of Voters website. During the Public Review period, any voter may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction requiring any of these materials to be amended or deleted. <b>§ 9380</b>
<b>August 7, 2026 (E-88)</b>	Statutory deadline for a District Board of Directors to request consolidation of a district election with the General Election by submitting a Resolution to the Board of Supervisors with a copy to the Registrar of Voters. <b>§ 10403</b>
<b>August 10, 2026 (E-85)</b>	Registrar of Voters will email measure letter designations to Districts that have measures on the ballot. <b>§ 13116</b>
<b>August 10, 2026 (E-85)</b>	Recommended deadline for filing of rebuttal arguments. Rebuttals must be filed 10 days after the direct arguments. <b>§ 9317</b>
<b>August 11, 2026 through August 20, 2026 (E-84 – 75)</b>	Public Review period for rebuttal arguments. Only Rebuttal Arguments are subject to legal action during this public review period. <b>§ 9380</b>
<b>August 12, 2026 (E-83)</b>	Statutory deadline for District Board of Directors to submit a resolution to the Registrar of Voters to withdraw a prior district measure order of election. <b>§ 9605</b>
<b>August 28, 2026 (E-67)</b>	The Registrar of Voters requests that the Court issue a potential order to change measure ordinance text, impartial analysis, financial impact, direct and rebuttal arguments by this date to ensure Registrar of Voters can meet election material mailing deadlines. <b>§ 9380</b>
<b>September 19, 2026 (E-45)</b>	Statutory deadline for Registrar of Voters to issue ballots and Voter Information Guides to military and overseas voters. <b>§ 3105</b>
<b>September 24, 2026 (E-40)</b>	Voter Information Guide mailing begins approximately this date. Mailing completed by <b>October 13, 2026 (E-21)</b> . <b>§ 13303(a)</b>
<b>October 5, 2026 (E-29)</b>	Ballot mailing to active registered voters begins. All Vote-By-Mail ballots will be issued through the Registrar of Voters. Requests for replacement mail ballots should be forwarded to the Registrar of Voters. <b>§§ 3000.5, 3001, 3014, 4005(a)(8)(A)</b>
<b>October 5, 2026 (E-29)</b>	Ballot drop boxes are open this day through Election Day. <b>§ 4005(a)(1)(B)</b>
<b>October 19, 2026 (E-15)</b>	Last day to register to vote for the November 3, 2026 General Election. <b>§ 2102</b>

<b>October 20, 2026 through November 3, 2026 (E-14 – E-0)</b>	Conditional Voter Registration period. During the 14 days prior to Election Day and including Election Day, an individual can go to the office of their county elections official, a satellite office, or to a Vote Center to conditionally register to vote and vote a provisional ballot. <b>§ 2170</b>
<b>October 24, 2026 (E-10)</b>	Beginning 10 days before the day of the election and continuing daily up to Election Day, select Vote Centers are open to the public. <b>§ 4005(a)(4)</b>
<b>October 31, 2026 (E-3)</b>	Beginning 3 days before the day of the election and continuing daily up to Election Day, additional Vote Centers are open to the public. <b>§ 4005(a)(3)</b>
<b>November 3, 2026 (E-0)</b>	Election Day. All Vote Centers will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Ballots will be centrally tallied at the Registrar of Voters' office. <b>§§ 1000, 14212</b>
<b>December 3, 2026 (E+30)</b>	Registrar of Voters will certify on or before this date. <b>§§ 15372, 15375</b>
